Having an EEG






A doctor may ask for a test to see what is happening inside your head



After the test you can wash the paste from your hair



It will help the doctor to see if you have epilepsy



The doctor will explain the results to you later




It can done at the hospital, or your day centre or your home

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The nurse will start the test it will not hurt



The nurse will explain how long the test will take



You may be asked to open & close your eyes



You will be asked to sit down





The Nurse will show you the machine



Small discs are put on your head with paste



Your head will be measured. This will not hurt
