
Top Ten Communication Tips.



- 1. Do not use medical jargon
- use straight forward simple language



- 2. Use Pictures and drawings to help explain
- use surrey communication book on all wards



3. Use family or carer to support patient



4. Listen to the patient and observe body language



5. Look people in the face; make eye contact, so patient can read your expressions



6. Use gestures and sign language to help explain or try objects of reference eg when asking if someone wants a drink use a cup to demonstrate



7. If patient wears a hearing aid or glasses make sure they are on before communicating with them



- 8. Be respectful, polite and helpful
- do not shout or patronise



9. Give patient and family time to ask questions
